





NPSD BOARD OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS

The North Penn School District Board of School Directors sets the policies that define the nature of public education from kindergarten through grade 12, including special education, community education, and summer education and enrichment programs. As elected officials, school board members must answer to the electorate and to the Pennsylvania Department of Education.

The nine school directors that make up North Penn's board assess the community's needs and aspirations to develop an educational program that is consistent with community resources. It is then the job of the superintendent of schools to work with the district's administration to creatively execute the board's objectives. It is also the superintendent's responsibility to bring recommendations to the board for action in carrying on the work of the North Penn School District.

Residents of the North Penn School District elect nine school directors at-large to serve four-year terms. Board members receive no compensation for their considerable commitment of time and energy; it is purely on a volunteer basis.

The North Penn Board of School Directors usually meets on the third Thursday of the month at 7:00 pm in the William J. Jacobs Board Room in the Educational Services Center, located at 401 E. Hancock Street in Lansdale. All formal action and decision-making takes place in these public meetings. The board usually meets the week before on Tuesday at 7:00 pm in the William J. Jacobs Board Room for a work session meeting. Please visit **www.npenn.org/school_board** to confirm the location of meetings during the 2023-2024 school year as they may change. The board of school directors is organized in a committee structure that allows school administrators to report to their respective committees. These committee meetings are also open to the public and are held at various times throughout the month. The following committees are open to the public:

- Safe Schools

Snow Closings/Inclement Weather

On snowy/icy mornings, tune in to North Penn Television (NPTV) on Comcast Cable channel 28 and Verizon FIOS channel 29 for the fastest information concerning school delays and closings. You can also log on to the North Penn School District website at **www.npenn.org**, "like" and follow NPSD on Facebook at **www.facebook.com/NorthPennSD** or follow NPSD on Twitter at **www.twitter.com/NPSD**.

Local television stations are also notified if schools are closed or delayed. If weather conditions worsen during the school day when school is in session, district officials may call for an early dismissal and utilize the emergency notification system.

When schools remain open during inclement weather, the district recognizes the basic right of parents and guardians to decide whether or not to send their children to school under such conditions. Such absences will be excused. Parents and students should also recognize that school buses may be delayed. In the case of snow days that need to be made up by students, days will be made up in this order: June 12, 2024; June 13, 2024; June 14, 2024. Any additional teacher or student days that need to be made up are added after June 14, 2024.



In addition to the NPSD electronic messenger program, individuals may register with the Montgomery County Community Alert System, which is administered by the Montgomery County Department of Public Safety. This system delivers important emergency alerts, notifications and updates to email accounts, and smart phones.

NPSD alerts the Department of Public Safety when a schoolrelated emergency occurs and a notification is distributed. In addition to NPSD updates, this alert system also sends information regarding non-school related emergencies, road closures, crime alerts and severe weather. School District Real Estate Taxes

All School District tax bills are mailed out by July 1. If you do not receive your tax bill shortly after the July 1 mail date, please contact the tax collector in your municipality to find out what your tax payment should be and/or make arrangements to obtain another copy of your tax bill. **Pennsylvania state law reads that non-receipt of a tax bill is not a valid reason for non-payment of taxes**.

Homestead approved properties will see the homestead exclusion deducted from their tax bill. If you are not homestead approved and would like to apply for the exclusion, forms may be obtained online through the Montgomery County Board of Assessments Office at **www.montcopa.org**. You must go into the section for departments and select the Office of Assessment Appeals. You will then see a link to select and print out the Homestead Application. Complete this form and return it to the address that is indicated in the instructions.

For anyone paying their taxes in full, a two percent discount is allowed if the school taxes are paid by August 31. All tax payments received after the date of August 31 and through October 31 must be paid at face value. All taxes received after October 31 will have a 7.5 percent penalty applied.

NPSD is offering all property owners the option of paying their tax bill in six equal installments. If you elect to pay your tax bill in installment payments, there is no discount offered and the first payment must be received in the office of the tax collector by July 31. Payments for installments received after that date will be returned and the full payment will then be expected. All other installment payments are due as specified on the tax bill and a penalty is added to each installment payment if not received on time in the office of the tax collector.

NPSD Offers Real Estate Tax Rebate Program

Certain homeowners and renters may qualify for this discount if applicants:

- have a household income of no more than \$35,000 annually for property owners and \$15,000 for renters; and
- be 65 years of age or older; or
- be a widow or widower aged 50 years of age or older; or
- be permanently disabled and 18 years of age or older.

The property tax and rent rebate program is based on the existing Pennsylvania Property Tax and Rent Rebate program. North Penn homeowners and renters must qualify for the state rebate program to qualify for the district rebate program. For more information, visit **www.npenn.org/taxrebate**.
